Gosport War Memorial Hospital encourages its staff and visitors to walk, cycle and use public transport where possible, as part of a healthy lifestyle.

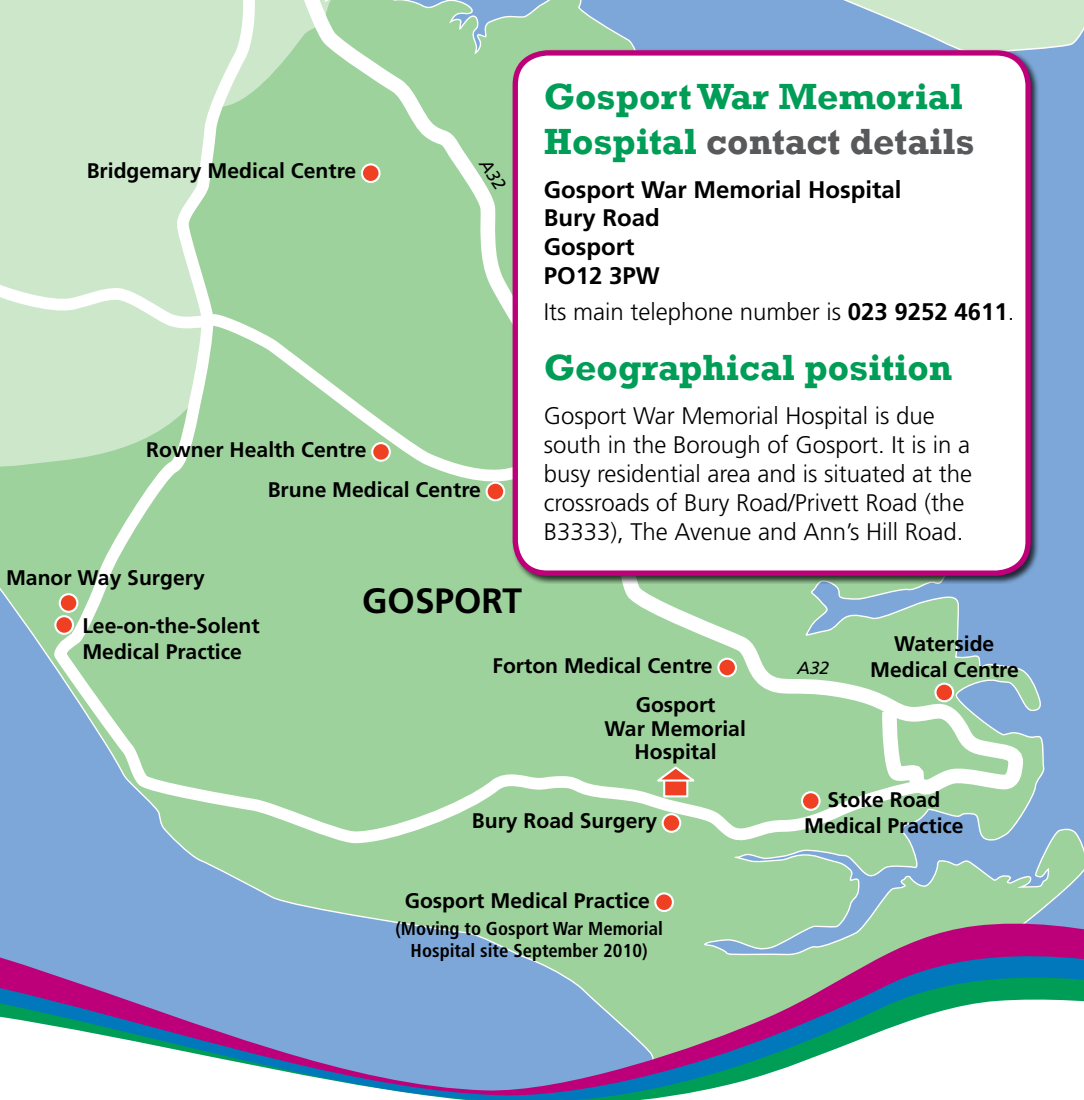

## Geographical position

Gosport War Memorial Hospital is due south in the Borough of Gosport. It is in a busy residential area and is situated at the crossroads of Bury Road/Privett Road (the B3333), The Avenue and Ann's Hill Road.



## Entrances

All entrances are protected by a canopy, have level access and the Main and Outpatients entrances have seating just inside. Patients can be dropped off under the canopy.

A reception desk is situated just inside each entrance and is manned during the hours shown below. Community Health Services reception is on the first floor.

The old main entrance in Bury Road (opposite the British Legion War Memorial) is now a Staff Only entrance.

### Main Hospital entrance – all departments

The main Hospital entrance is in Ann's Hill Road. The doors are side to side opening and are open from 8am to 9pm from Monday to Friday, and 9am to 9pm on Saturday and Sunday.

### Outpatients Department

The Outpatients Department entrance is in Bury Road. The doors are side to side opening and are open from 8am to 6pm from Monday to Friday.

### Endoscopy and Community Health Services

The entrance to the Endoscopy Department on the ground floor and the Community Health Services department on the first floor, is in Bury Road. The automatic door opens outwards and is open from 8am to 5pm from Monday to Friday.

### Minor Injuries Department

The entrance to the Minor Injuries Department is at the rear of the Hospital and can be accessed by Ann's Hill Road or Bury Road. The doors are side to side opening and are open from 8am to 9pm, seven days a week.



## How to get to the Hospital

### On foot

The streets around the Hospital are completely flat with pavements bordering the roads.

#### Main Hospital entrance

Pedestrians can access from Ann's Hill Road through the car park entrance/exit across textured, dropped areas, to the main Hospital entrance.

This part of Ann's Hill Road is busy as the junction of the B3333, Ann's Hill Road and The Avenue is 200 metres further on from the car park entrance.

There is no pedestrian crossing outside the entrance to the site in Ann's Hill Road but patients/visitors walking down Privett Road from a westerly direction can cross Ann's Hill Road at its junction with Privett Road/Bury Road, as it is controlled by traffic lights. This crossing area has textured lowered pavements.

#### Outpatients, Endoscopy and Community Health Services entrance

Pedestrians can access from Bury Road through the car park entrance and exit or via a textured area of pavement opposite the Community Services entrance.

There is a controlled push button operation pedestrian crossing in Bury Road, about 20 metres from the car park exit, in an easterly direction. The pavements at this point are lowered and textured.

It is possible to access the site from the Ann's Hill Road entrance and follow the pavement through the grounds to the entrances in Bury Road, keeping the Hospital building on your left and vice versa – access the site from the Bury Road entrance and follow the pavement through to the Ann's Hill Road entrance, keeping the Hospital building on your right.

Walking to Health leaflets are available from information racks in the Hospital.



### By bicycle

Gosport is well provided with cycle tracks. It is linked to the National Cycle Network and cycle paths have also been provided by the local authority. In July 2004 the Gosport Borough Council published a map of the existing and proposed cycle paths in the Borough and this is available online at [www3.hants.gov.uk/gosport.pdf](http://www3.hants.gov.uk/gosport.pdf).

Members of the public can secure their bicycle to fixed 'hoops' or stands around the site:

- next to the main Hospital entrance in Ann's Hill Road
- next to the Outpatients entrance in Bury Road
- in the area between the main hospital in Ann's Hill Road and the older part of the Hospital in Bury Road (follow the hospital road round towards Bury Road, keeping the Hospital on your left).

### By bus

#### Ann's Hill Road

Bus stops are situated on both sides of the road, a few metres in a northerly direction from the main entrance to the Hospital. The bus stops have a canopy but no seating. A timetable is posted up at both bus stops.

#### Bury Road

Bus stops are situated on both sides of the road, right outside the Hospital for buses going towards Gosport Ferry and about 20 metres to the east, for buses going towards Lee-on-the-Solent, other areas of Gosport and Fareham. The bus stops are sheltered, with fixed seating.





### By bus ...continued

The local bus operator is First Group and a total of 6 buses an hour go past the Hospital. The numbers 82, 88 and 88a stop directly outside of Gosport War Memorial Hospital, the 34, 72 and 72a stop at Privett Roundabout, just over half a mile in a westerly direction and the 85, 86 and 87 stop in nearby Whitworth Road. (Leaving the Hospital in Bury Road, proceed east and take the first turning left). The 85, 86 and 88a run into the evening up to approx 11pm.

Other bus routes connect Gosport Ferry (the end of the peninsular) with Southampton to the west and Fareham to the north, where there are connections to Portsmouth.

### By train/ferry to Portsmouth

The nearest train stations are at Fareham, five miles to the north and Portsmouth Harbour – approximately one mile in an easterly direction to the Gosport Ferry and a five minute ferry ride.

Ferries commence on the Gosport side at 0530 hours and travel every 15 minutes 'off peak' and every 5 minutes during the 'rush' hour. Ferries run to and from the Isle of Wight from Portsmouth Harbour, Old Portsmouth and Rudmore at approximately half hour intervals.

### By car

The car parking spaces on the site are managed by Town and City Parking Ltd.

Terms and conditions of parking are displayed at the two unrestricted vehicular entrances to the site, one in Ann's Hill Road and one in Bury Road. Parking incorrectly may result in the issue of a fixed penalty notice.

In Ann's Hill Road, there is one combined entrance/exit, with vehicles signposted in a clockwise direction round the car park. Vehicles can turn left or right when exiting the site.

In Bury Road there is a separate entrance and exit. Vehicles can turn left or right when exiting.

The Hospital site has 190 car parking spaces (there is currently no separately marked area for motorcycles):

- 61 Pay and Display spaces, of which 8 Disabled are non-pay
- 102 Staff spaces, including 4 Disabled
- 12 Staff spaces for car sharers
- 14 short term spaces
- There is no separately marked area for motorcycles.

Please do not park on the adjoining residential roads

Drivers using the Pay and Display should find a space then purchase a ticket at one of the machines situated around the car parks for the required amount of parking time. The machines only accept coins and do not give change. Change can be obtained at reception in the main Hospital entrance.



Parking charges are in force from 8.30am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, excluding Bank Holidays and are:

- 50p → Up to 1 hour
- £1 → Up to 2 hours
- £2 → Up to 4 hours
- £5 → Over 4 hours



Holders of Disabled Blue Badges can park in the Disabled spaces free of charge, as long as a valid Blue Badge is displayed.
