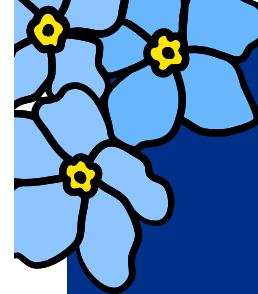
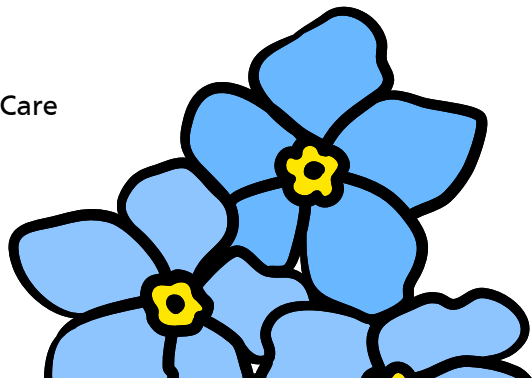

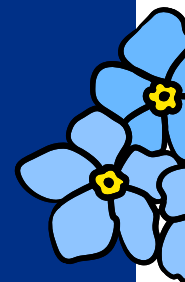

Portsmouth Hospitals University NHS Trust

Patients with dementia and their carers have access to:

- Admiral Nurse Service that supports families affected by dementia during and after their admission
- Dementia case workers who support people with dementia during their admission
- Palliative Care team who provide end of life and palliative care during admissions
- Dementia champions within each division who provide enhanced support to people with dementia
- Virtual veteran and dementia carer's café – last Tuesday of every month, 1pm to 3pm
- Virtual carers of people with dementia support group – every Tuesday, 11am to 11.45am
- Virtual Young Onset Dementia Carers support group – fourth Thursday of every month, 7pm to 8pm
